HIGHLIGHTS OF OUR IMPACT

EDUCATION

Annual Conference

The Brain Injury Association of Pennsylvania (BIAPA) coordinates a two-day conference designed for professionals, researchers, educators, students, survivors, family members, caregivers, and other interested persons. This signature event provides opportunities for the attendees to learn from experts and each other through conference presentations and networking. Professionals are also able to earn continuing education units/credits (CEUs). A significant portion of the survivor and caregiver participants are able to attend thanks to scholarships provided by the organization and generous donors.

ReDiscoverU

Established by the Council on Brain Injury (CoBI), the ReDiscoverU Program assists individuals to learn new skills or rediscover past interests through inclusive and diverse educational opportunities that enhance the health, well-being, and knowledge of those who participate in the classes. In 2023, BIAPA began hosting the ReDiscoverU Program.

Brain Safety Fairs

Each year prior to the COVID-19 restrictions, BIAPA presented educational and fun-filled Brain Safety Fairs throughout the commonwealth. Many events included the fitting and distribution of free bicycle helmets. These programs began again in 2023.

Training Services

BIAPA provides a variety of professional educational and training programs that include: Brain Injury Basics, Certified Brain Injury Specialist (CBIS) Preparation Courses, and Brain Injury 101, 201, and 301. Expansion of these offerings was undertaken in 2023.

ADVOCACY

Federal Level: Brain Injury Awareness Day on Capitol Hill

Each March, the Congressional Brain Injury Task Force hosts Brain Injury Awareness Day in Washington, DC, to observe Brain Injury Awareness Month. This day is dedicated to educating elected officials about the full range of brain injury's effects, the challenges faced by persons living with brain injury and by their families, and the services and supports available to them.

State Level: Brain Injury Coalition

BIAPA participates in advocacy efforts on behalf of the brain injury community by participating in the Brain Injury Coalition and serving in an advisory capacity on policy issues.

HIGHLIGHTS OF OUR IMPACT (CONTINUED)

SUPPORT

Brain Injury Resource Line (BIRL) 1-800-444-6443

BIAPA's Brain Injury Resource Line (BIRL) is staffed by volunteers who are able to provide information about resources that may be of help to people with brain injury or their families.

Brain Injury Ambassador Program

Developed through a partnership between the Pennsylvania (PA) Department of Health and BIAPA, the Brain Injury Ambassador Program connects with the families and caregivers of persons who have recently experienced a brain injury, delivering a message of hope and letting them know they are not alone.

Brain Injury Opioid Misuse

BIAPA is committed to raising awareness of the intersection of brain injury and opioid misuse. Through a contract with the Pennsylvania Department of Health and their Brain Injury and Opioids Initiative, BIAPA provides training and consultation to professionals providing treatment for substance use disorder.

BrainSTEPS School Consultation

After sustaining a brain injury, many students return to school with lingering effects that affect their classroom performance. The BrainSTEPS School Consulting Program was created by the PA Department of Health in 2007, and is jointly funded by the PA Department of Health and the PA Department of Education, Bureau of Special Education, via the PaTTAN network. BrainSTEPS is implemented by BIAPA and is available to all Pennsylvania public school students in grades K-12, at no cost to their families. BrainSTEPS is designed to provide consultation to school teams and families in the development and delivery of educational services for students who have experienced any type of acquired brain injury.

Child and Adolescent Work Group:

BIAPA created a Child and Adolescent Work Group to promote understanding of the needs of individuals with pediatric brain injuries AND the support needed by their parents and caregivers. The work group began meeting in September of 2023 and has been meeting virtually by Zoom on the third Thursday of each month at 3:00 p.m. Presentations on pediatric brain injury topics were included in the BIAPA 2024 Annual Conference and in the Call for Presentations forthe 2025 Annual Conference.

Support Groups and Social Opportunities

BIAPA currently supports 25 active support groups across the commonwealth (either in person or virtually) and a national virtual support group. Our support groups provide significant opportunities for social interaction, support, and sharing of resources. In January 2023, we also began hosting a virtual support group for the caregivers of individuals who have experienced brain injury; this support group is ongoing, held monthly.

Run, walk, and roll events, which are held throughout Pennsylvania, provide significant awareness of brain injury and social opportunities for participants, in addition to obtaining financial support for BIAPA.

NeuroResource Facilitation

Funded by the federal Administration for Community Living and offered through a partnership between the PA Department of Health and BIAPA, this free service is for individuals impacted by brain injury, their families, and community organizations. Facilitators connect them with public and private resources/systems that will address their needs.

RESEARCH

Grants/Contracts/Partnerships

BIAPA is a significant partner to the PA Department of Health, the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), and other national leaders in the healthcare community. Through a variety of contracts and grants, BIAPA is relied upon to coordinate and lead various initiatives, including the Juvenile Justice Program and a program to understand Brain Injury and Opioid Misuse.
